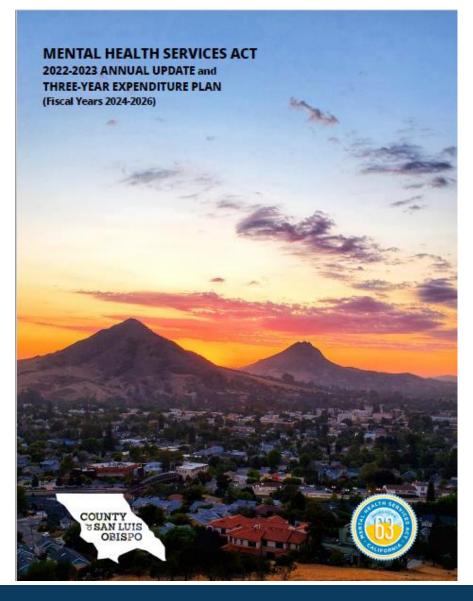

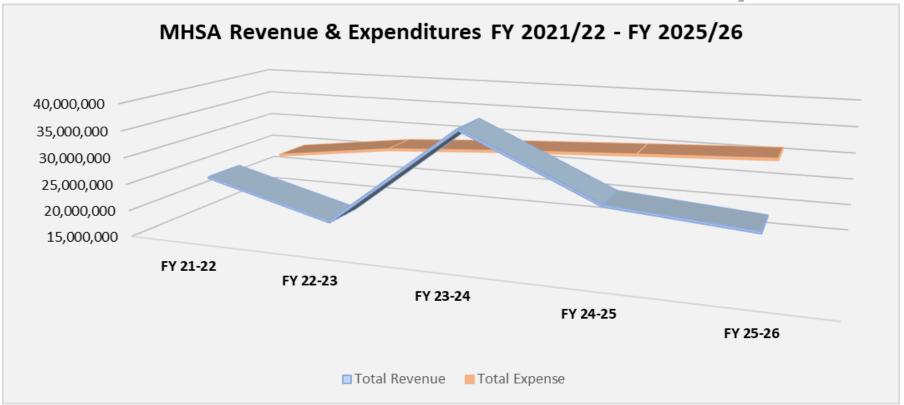

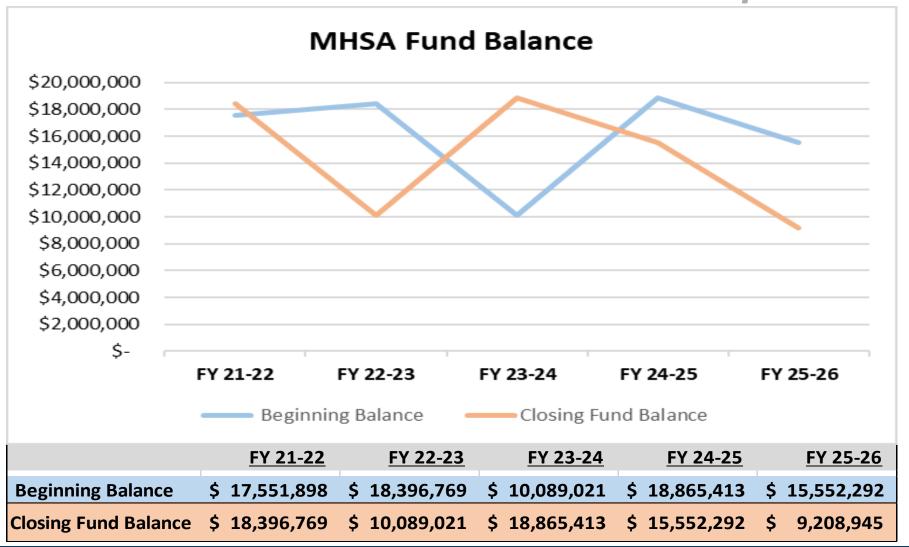

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- FY 2022/23 MHSA Revenue projected to decrease by about 39% due to:
 - ➤ Current year cash transfers were approximately 18% lower than prior year through December 2022
 - > Federal and State tax relief due to storm damage
 - Individuals and businesses impacted by 2022-23 winter storms
 - qualify for an extension to file and pay taxes until October 16, 2023
 - Impacts personal income tax payments that would have been received in FY22/23
 - Q1 through Q3 estimated tax payments
 - 2022 tax filings
 - Estimate \$500 to \$600 million of MHSA revenue that would have
 - been received in FY22/23 will shift to FY23/24
 - ➤ Historically largest annual adjustment (\$2.37 billion) will post to the MHSA Fund in July or August 2023

- Fund Balance 05/26/2023 (excluding actual PR) = \$15,825,413
 - ➤ Prudent Reserve Fund Balance = \$2,774,412



BEHAVIORAL HEALTH REFORM PROPOSAL

Announced on March 19th as a part of the Governor's State of the State Tour

1. Authorize New General Bond \$3-\$5B - Fall 2024 ballot

 Fund unlocked community behavioral health residential settings including for homeless yets

2. Modernize MHSA – Fall 2024 ballot

• Themes around the need to update the Act and prioritize spending for the most vulnerable and references to homeless encampments

3. Statewide Enhancement of Fiscal Transparency & Accountability Entire Behavioral Health System

• Increased accountability across all public and private payers for behavioral health



MHSA REFORM PROPOSAL

- Modification from 5 Components to 3 Categories
 - New Housing Category
 - Standalone FSP Category
 - "Other" Category
- Additional Reforms to MHSA
 - Use MHSA as last dollar for Medi-Cal match
 - Allowing for funding of SUD only conditions
 - Restructuring of MHSOAC
 - Additional Transparency & Accountability
- Acknowledged need for workforce



MHSA REFORM PROPOSAL

- Potential Categorical Component Impacts on SLO County in 2025-2026
 - 30% New Housing Category (approx. \$6M, annually)
 - As of now there has been no definition of what this may consist of, but our current work plans have only a small amount of housing/services.*
 - · 35% Standalone FSP Category (approx. \$7.1M)
 - Our current FSP expenses would meet this threshold.
 - · 35% "Other" Category (approx. \$7.1M)
 - Not defined, but assumed to capture remaining CSS< WET, PEI, and CFTN
 - *Because very little would be moved into the Housing Category, approximately one-third of MHSA programs could be impacted.
