Emergency Transport Contract, Term 7/1/24 – 6/30/26.	V. Pierucci
The SLO EMS Agency makes the recommendation to renegotiate a two-year contract with SLA with several	
additions, changes, and deletions to the updated agreement. EMS Director Vince Pierucci reviewed all	
changes, as specified in the recorded Staff Report, with a supplemental PowerPoint presentation that details	
the reasoning and research involved with all proposed changes. Changes would involve implementing	
response time liquidated damages. From average noncompliance times, an estimated \$300k in fines is	
expected to be incurred. Recommendation to fold Cal Poly into SLO response time zone to favor the	
contractor, Recommendation to move 10 min response time to 10:59 to favor the contractor. Med Comm contract, and estimated \$67/call, would be approximately \$ 2.4 million/year. The ambulance licensing fee	
of \$180/ambulance is estimated at \$4,000 per year based on a time study by EMS Agency staff of an	
average of 2 hours/ambulance. The proposed fines shouldn't be more than implementing an additional unit	
to the system. This is favorable to the contractor's bottom line. The customer satisfaction survey has a fine	
of \$500/call which is below 80% satisfaction. This is to reduce complaints received by the public and to	
promote exceptional customer service. The contract with San Luis Ambulance (SLA) ends June 2024, so	
EMS makes the recommendation to implement the changes and renegotiate the contract with SLA.

Discussion D. McCrain – Having a background with Cambria Ambulance, I think the customer satisfaction survey is a	
good idea. Could we roll the response time to 9:59?

- V. Pierucci I have thought about reducing the response time, but they struggle with 10:59 and if it is reduced, they would have to add more cars which would up the costs.
- D. McCrain Ambulance licensing justification, would this be beneficial to cost recovery?
- V. Pierucci This would be far below cost recovery. It would not cover everything.
- R. Campbell How receptive would the contractor be?
- V. Pierucci The contractor seemed to have positive things to say about the conversation we had on 11/28/23.
- M. Bronson Question about timing, It feels like there should be another step in the process. Is there an opportunity to come back after discussing with others to make the best possible decision?
- V. Pierucci We need to get the contract renewed and we would like to get this on the agenda in April/May 2024. My recommendation is to move forward due to the time frame and complexity of the ambulance contracts.
- J. Stornetta I would also like an opportunity to bring this to CalFire and the Five Cities Fire Chiefs. Pierucci We will have to look at the meeting the third week of January to meet as soon as possible as we don't want to delay anything.
- J. Stornetta I would like to open the discussion with any other comments.
- C. Javine Our conversation yesterday was good, but we have some concerns and would like to go over the definitions more thoroughly as it is changing operational things and would have financial impacts. Would we even have enough revenue? It will take us some time to review so we can continue.
- N. Drews It would be interesting to hear your perspective, but we want to make sure that things are standard. We don't want this to be a revenue-generating thing. Is the language of the contract, correct?
- C. Javine We don't want to pay the fines, but I think we have always been open to adjusting. The ambulance industry is varied, and I don't think there is a standard in the state.
- J. Kelton We will work with everyone on negotiating a new contract and need additional time to calculate the impact, both financially and operationally, as there are a lot of changes.
- N. Drews We want to set you up for success and I like the idea of a contract that has things in it that benefit everyone. Contract 1. Must do something, and 2. Has the right consequences.
- M. Bronson I think this would benefit from one more month. The third week of January meeting to go over again.
- V. Pierucci Would January 17th or January 18th work?
- M. Bronson I already have January 18th set with a meeting scheduled for the 18th.
- V. Pierucci Then January 18th at 1:30 p.m.
- M. Bronson Could we have copies of the charts and the PP?
- V. Pierucci Yes.
- P. Borenstein This has gone unsaid for a very long time, but I do think other counties have support from ambulance companies and it might be the right time to say that we need the support from the ambulance company.
- J. Stornetta I applaud Vince for this. I am also sympathetic to SLA. I throw it out to the committee that maybe we phase this in as it might be too much at once.
- V. Pierucci Could we have clarity on a transition?
- M. Bronson Is this a transition, do we need this all at once or can we phase it in in steps?
- J. Stornetta What does that look like, and can we leave the door open for more conversation?
- V. Pierucci If there is a desire to change the process there would have to be an RFP. We only have six months to figure things out.
- J. Stornetta I was talking more about the transitional agreement. I don't want to go through an RFP or administrative extensions. What does it look like in the contract?
- N. Drews This is more of a MOV. This isn't intended to break anyone's back, and I would want us to come to a point where it would say "must" do.
- J. Stornetta I am not willing to waive the 10-minute response time.
- V. Pierucci To clarify, 10:59 or 9:59?
- J. Stornetta 9:59, it should say 10 minutes so really 9:59.
- V. Pierucci It will put a lot of pressure on the contractor, and it will change compliance.
- J. Stornetta Any other discussions?
- M. Bronson I want to thank SLA for being a community partner.
- R. Campbell I am looking forward to conversations and working with your team.
- J. Stornetta Would you be able to put out a summary with 9:59 response times?
- V. Pierucci Yes, we will make the change. SLO EMS Agency will change all response time data and proposed average fines to reflect 9:59 instead of the current practice of 10:50, as the response time required is 10 minutes and not 11 minutes.
